BUDGET UPDATE

Just a quick couple of notes on how we are doing so far this year:

As of June 30th, pledges were behind by about \$9,958. For our annual budget, we are running a deficit of approximately \$6,333.

If you are wondering how we are getting things that are not listed in the budget paid for, we have some "special funds" called designated funds that anyone can donate to at any time. These funds are separate from our operating funds. Our two most recent projects completed with these funds include replacement of one air conditioner and replacement of flooring in back hallway and nursery. We have some funds for another HVAC unit that needs to be replaced but we are currently about \$1800 short for the next unit. The flooring for the rest of the downstairs also needs to be replaced. The flooring currently in the parish hall was installed in 1977 when the parish hall was built. Should you feel moved to do so, please consider donations to either of these projects. Just write on your check what it is for and it will be journaled accordingly until enough funds are available to complete the projects. Thank you.

As most of you know, Chris Crocker is our Junior Warden in 2025. He and his helpers have been quite busy at accomplishing a number of things in the first half of 2025. Some of these items were very long, drawn out projects, but Chris and his team successfully tackled and completed these projects:

Jedidiah Worcester was baptized on July 20th during our regular service. Here are some highlights from his big day. Welcome to the fold, Jedidiah!























Presentation of the Baptismal Candle To the Family

THE ST. LUKE'S / CHRIST CHURCH CONNECTION





Many of our current church members are new to the area and have asked "Why do we move our service and worship at St. Luke's church every now and then?"

Your answer is: IT IS OUR MOTHER CHURCH!

Yes, our congregation started as the congregation of St. Luke's Church. Local legend dates St. Luke's back to 1632 and that date was believed to be correct until the deed was researched and a date was discovered in the top beam over the door frame. Historians now believe that St. Luke's was built between 1685 and 1687. Colonel Joseph Bridger commissioned the building of the church. Now, historians are comfortable with the claim at St. Luke's remains Virginia's oldest surviving church building.

The transformation begins......

Our congregation continued to worship at St. Luke's until the 1830's when some land in the town of Smithfield (incorporated in 1752) was donated to build a new church that would be a more convenient location for worship for the townspeople. In 1832, Christ Episcopal Church was established and the Old Brick Church, now known as St. Luke's, was abandoned.

CREATION CARE

I have asked gardeners about the striped caterpillars eating my dill plants. All are familiar with these common swallowtail caterpillars, and I am told that they also eat parsley and fennel. They turn into beautiful butterflies and important pollinators, so I let them have all my dill!

Heads up to anyone interested in adding solar panels to your roof to offset energy costs and generate clean energy - the 30% tax credit is ending December 31, 2025 instead of being phased out through 2034. 
